Introduction

Project SHARE (Supplying Hemophilia Aid and Relief Everywhere) is a program of LA Kelley

Communications, Inc. that donates antihemophilic factor and ancillary medical supplies to patients with bleeding disorders in developing countries. Founded in 2002, Project SHARE is the first program of its kind. It is privately funded, and primarily donates factor that would otherwise be destroyed. Project SHARE partners with manufacturers and homecare companies, and donates medicine to many patients who do not qualify for assistance from any other source.

Project SHARE also serves as a central advisory agency for all US HTCs, hemophilia nonprofits, homecare companies, and patients seeking information on successfully donating humanitarian product overseas.

Summary and Accomplishments

- Donated 3,117,649 IUs of factor.
- · Brokered an emergency shipment to India of 1 million IUs of extremely short-dated factor IX that no other organization would accept.
- Introduced Project SHARE to the US FDA.
- Brokered 500,000 IUs of factor IX to Pakistan and Belize.
- Brokered 30,000 IUs of factor IX to Mexico.
- Welcomed two new corporate partners to the program: Mr. Sam Marshall from Novo Pharmaceuticals, Inc. and Mr. Joe Gibbons from ZLB Behring.
- Created Project SHARE brochure and stationery.
- Donated 145,000 IUs of factor VIII to German N., Nicaragua, for life-saving kidney surgery.
- Donated 40,588 IUs of factor VIII to John A., Ecuador, for life-saving abdominal surgery.
- · Emailed weekly updates on factor donations to WFH, Board members, and interested parties.
- · Purchased new refrigerator and instituted twice-daily temperature control checks.
- Collaborated with AmeriCares.

Ukraine

Project SHARE donated 22,100 IUs of factor VIII to Sergei Y., age 22, for surgery to shorten one of his legs.

German N. had life-saving kidney surgery when Project SHARE donated 145,000 IUs of factor VIII.

Morocco

Ancillary Supply Donations


Project SHARE donates ancillary medical supplies to patients and hemophilia societies worldwide. Our shipments in 2003 included:

- St. Vincent and the Grenadines: 25 lbs. to a family on Mavreau Island.
- · Honduras: 23 lbs. to the Honduran Hemophilia Association.
- Dominican Republic: 1,782 lbs. to Fundación Apoyo al Hemofílico.
- Zimbabwe: 20 lbs. to the Zimbabwe Haemophilia Association.

Source of Factor Donations

Project SHARE allows US individuals, HTCs, NHF chapters and organizations—who use more of the world's factor than any other country—to donate unwanted and in-date factor and medical supplies. Project SHARE does not actively seek donations from factor manufacturers. We attempt to recoup unused, unwanted or excess factor that is about to be destroyed from diverse sources in the US marketplace. We accept any size donation, from one bottle to hundreds of bottles.


Factor Sources 2003

- Promoting Project SHARE in HemAware (readership) 20,000), Bloodstone (readership 8,000) and Boston Globe. Continuing quarterly Project SHARE profiles in PEN (readership 5,000).
